Investigating Patterns

To be able to create a pattern using stencils.




Do you know what a stencil is? How do we use stencils? Think, pair, share



Stencils can be great for making patterns.
This is how you do it...









Draw the picture you would like for your stencil on a thick piece of card. Remember, you only need the outline so don't worry about things like faces or clothes.

Carefully cut around the shape keeping the edges as neat as possible.

Draw around the shape carefully trying not to let the stencil move.

Remove the stencil to reveal the shape.

This looks
easy!


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Now repeat the process, moving the stencil to where you want it to create a pattern. You can turn it around, flip it, overlap shapes...anything!








Once you have made your stencil and pattern there are many ways you could colour in your pattern.



Shading

Make your patterns look 3D by shading darkly around the outside and lightly in the middle.

Cross-hatching

The more times you draw lines crossing over, the darker the shading becomes.

Dotting

Use more or less dots to create light and dark effects.

Patterns

Make a pattern with two shapes. Lines and dots are used here.
